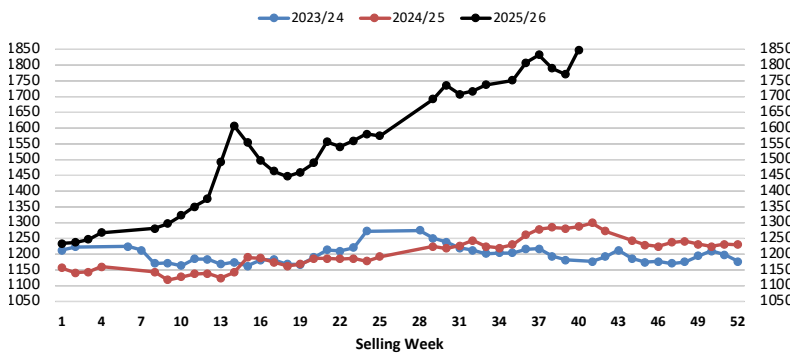

COMMENTARY

In a stunning turnaround after a fortnight of losses the market not only changed direction but continued to leave its foot on the accelerator for the entire week. Tuesday's opening was dearer from the commencement of sales with the Northern region indicator closing plus 25 cents. This rocketed on Wednesday with a further 52 cents added, for a cumulative gain of 77 cents for the week. In positive news this continued in the Western region market after the Eastern seaboard had closed with the Western region indicator climbing 114 cents for the week. It has taken three weeks of uncertainty, but all three national selling centres have come back into relative alignment. The broad based Eastern market indicator eclipsed its 2019 high of three weeks ago by 3 cents. A lower national offering, a more favourable exchange rate, a one week Easter recess and a narrative of don't panic regarding international hostility appears to have allowed the market to look forward and continue along the lines of what has been a solid uptrend. The positive rises in the 19 micron and finer types were overdue and indicate a healthy market. 35,602 bales were sold nationally for the week with the passed in rate falling to a miserly 1.8%. Major buyers included PJ Morris, Techwool and Endeavour Wool. There is a one week Easter recess next week. ***This report will resume on the 17th of April.***
